

Course Selection

<u>Credits</u>

Required Courses:52Elective Courses:28

Total: 80 credits (=20 courses) minimum, including *at least* 16 Grade 12 credits (4 courses)

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

<u>Credits</u>

Students frequently graduate with more than the minimum 80 credits—some with 100, 120+

Your goals: Graduation vs. Postsecondary preparation vs. Scholarship...

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS Assessments: 2022 Graduates must write: Numeracy 10 Assessment Literacy 10 Assessment Literacy 12 Assessment = Math & English skills!

- English Studies 12 Honours
- English First Peoples 12

ALL 3 options are recognized equally by colleges and universities

ELL Students

If English is NOT your first language, there may be language support classes that can be added to your schedule.

See your ELL support teacher (Ms. McTavish) in September.

If you know you'd like an ELL support block, simply request "ELL Support" as an Elective choice

Social Studies 12 Options

- BC First Peoples 12
- Comparative Cultures 12
- Social Justice 12
- Law Studies 12
- Political Studies 12
- Human Geography 12
- 20th Century World History 12

All these options satisfy the Socials 11/12 grad requirement

Social Studies 12 Options

- Only 1 Socials 11/12 course is required for graduation
- Many students take 3 or more academic preparation for Social Sciences/ Humanities/ Arts programs
- Most of the Socials 11/12 courses qualify as "academic 12" courses for post-secondary programs – but do your research to be sure!


Social Studies Electives

- Gender & Sexuality 12
- Criminology 12

These are high interest electives They don't satisfy the Socials graduation requirement

Math 11 Options

- Workplace Math 11 (meets admission requirements - some college programs)
- Foundations of Math 11 (meets admission requirements for many university programs)
- Pre-calculus Math 11 (necessary for several university programs, such as Commerce, Math, Science, Engineering, Computer Science)
- Do your research...



Check your Math 11

- a. Pre-calculus 11 (A or high B in FMP 10 recommended)
- b. Foundations of Math 11
- c. Workplace Math 11
- Check your teacher's recommendation

Choosing Math 12

*Math 12 - NOT required for graduation

- *It IS required for some post-secondary programs
- *Calculus 12 Universities don't usually require it but several programs recommend it

*Research your PSI & program carefully

Science 11/12 Options

- Chemistry 11 (A or B in Foundations-Pre-cal Math 10 strongly recommended)
- Chemistry 12 (Chem 11 required)
- Physics 11 (strong results in FMP 10 required)
- Physics 12 (Phys 11 required)
- Life Sciences 11
- Earth Science 11



Anatomy & Physiology 12
 These options all satisfy the Science Grad requirement

Science 11/12

- 1 science 11/12 required for graduation
- Many students take 3 or more sciences
- Several post-secondary programs require specific science courses
- Anatomy 12 may be taken without Life Sciences 11 - a grade 11 science is recommended
- Students often take a grade 11 & 12 science in the same year



Science 11/12 Electives

- Astronomy 11
- Marine Biology 12

These are high interest electives They don't satisfy the Science graduation requirement They may support your application to a post-secondary sciences program

Electives

Select 3 12 grade 12 electives + 3 more at any grade (or 4 if CLE completed)

> FRIM students – select 2 grade 12 + 4 more

Select 2 alternates

Select 1 or more "Outside-thetimetable" elective(s) – in addition

Choosing Electives

- In general, choose gr. 11 electives unless you've already taken them
- Check pre-requisites for gr. 11/12 electives (on VHS website)
- Repeating a course: if you re-take the same course, same grade level, you only earn credits once.

Outside the Timetable Electives

Courses offered in the morning/lunch/after school – don't take a block in the timetable

What is Dual Credit?

A chance to earn <u>BOTH</u> high school and post secondary credits

 -You become a Camosun/UVic student
 -You take a post-secondary course (tuition is covered) while a high school student

You do pay for texts and student fees





Dual Credit cont'd.

DUAL CREDIT Law 12 at Vic High

Receive Credit for Law Studies 12 AND Criminal Justice 154 = 8 credits



✤ OPEN TO GRADE 12 STUDENTS ONLY

Co-taught by Mr. Wallace & a Camosun Criminology Instructor **Dual Credit Options at Camosun**

Earn BOTH highs school and Camosun credits, while taking select courses/programs at Camosun. Some examples are:

- Trades
- Computer Tech
- Business Administration
- Legal Office Assistant
- Interactive Media Developer
- Indigenous Family Support Worker
- Health Care Assistant
- Professional Cook etc.



Dual Credit Program Options at Camosun

- You become a Camosun student
- The district pays for the courses
- You pay for texts and student fees

<u>Ustart at UVIC</u>



- A an opportunity for highly academic students to take a university course at UVIC, while in Grade 12
- You earn university credit, AND high school credit
- The district pays the tuition, you pay the student fees & buy textbooks

Post-Secondary Options

 Graduation: Complete all required courses & earn at least 16/80 credits (Gr. 12/total credits)

2. College Career Programs: Wide variety of programs – some specific math and/or English requirements – do your research!

Post-Secondary Options (cont'd.)

3. University Transfer Programs (UT): college courses that may transfer to universities – English Studies 12 with minimum C+ (+ Math/ Science courses for some programs)

Post-Secondary Options (cont'd.)

- 4. University Entrance: English 12 + three to five academic grade 12 courses (confirm with the university); sometimes a 2nd language to gr. 11
- Specific programs require specific Grade 11/12 Gr. 12 courses in area of intended study
- Minimum Grade for EN 12 varies by university
- Do your research!
