As we close out the year, I would like to acknowledge our staff and students. Despite the many challenges that came with moving to our temporary site, re-organizing classes into the unanticipated 'cohort' model and implementing extensive safety protocols, our students had a very successful year. Our success rate was one of the highest we have seen in years, our graduates earned an unprecedented \$350,000 in scholarships and most importantly our staff and students were able to attend school safely all year.

To the 2021 grads – congratulations! The 145th graduating class of Vic High will have the distinction of being our pandemic grads. In the face of unusual and trying circumstances you demonstrated great leadership, caring and poise. We wish you all the best in your futures.

We received mixed news about our school's renovations. While we are delighted that the project is officially going to include an all-weather turf field, a community kitchen and a support hub for our partners in the intercultural association, we are obviously disappointed that the project completion date has been pushed back a full year. The delay will inarguably have an impact on our students, however we are steadfast in our commitment to provide a full 'Vic High' school experience for our students. Next year we will be offering Dual Credit Law for the first time, looking to reinstating our Hand Anatomy course and adding a new section of music. With the return of extracurricular activities, our intention is to test out the full capacity of our current location. Along with the use of the Topaz playing fields the Topaz Campus features an additional art studio and fully renovated fitness, hair and dance studios.



2021 Scholarships

Vic High graduates have once again secured a record number of scholarships and bursaries to support them in their post-secondary pursuits.

Thanks to the generous support of our community and the Alumni Association, Vic High proudly awards 50 scholarships worth more than \$32,000 directly to graduating students every year.

In addition to this, 2021 graduates have won over \$350,000 in school district and community bursaries as well as post-secondary entrance scholarships.

In total, 104 scholarships/bursaries have been presented to 57 different graduates, for a total of over \$385,000. This means that more than 25% of our 2021 graduates have received financial support for their post-secondary aspiration.

The staff at Vic High wishes all our graduates all the best in their future pursuits. We know that you will make us proud.

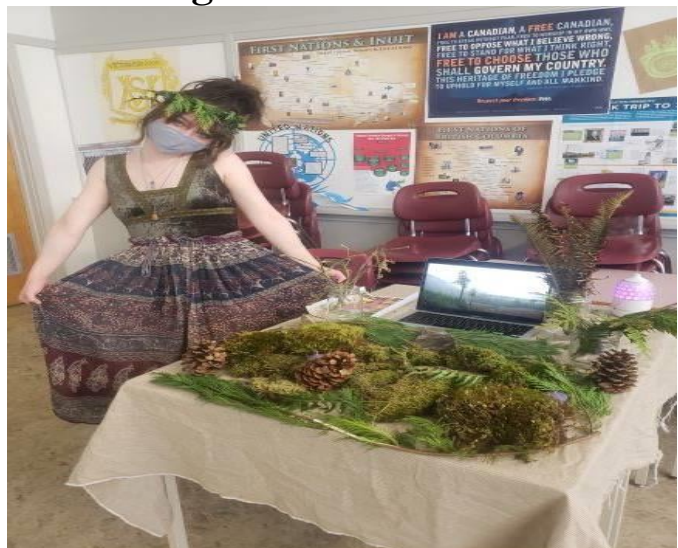

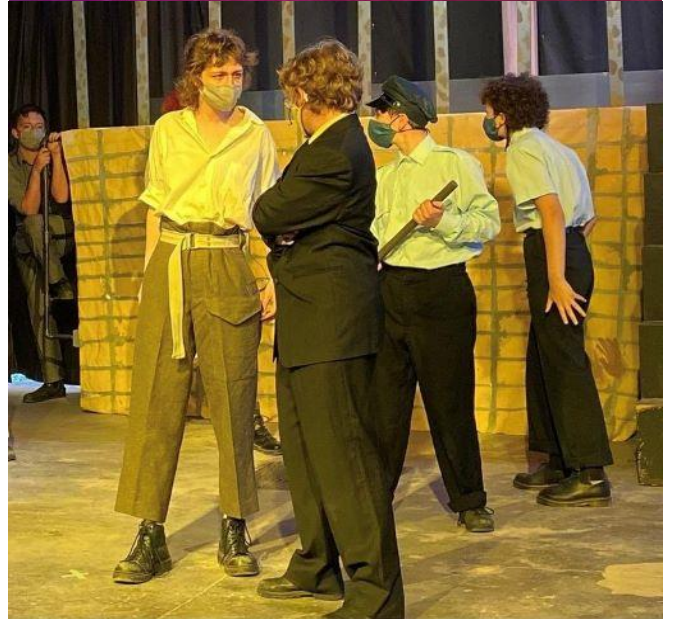

Track and Field



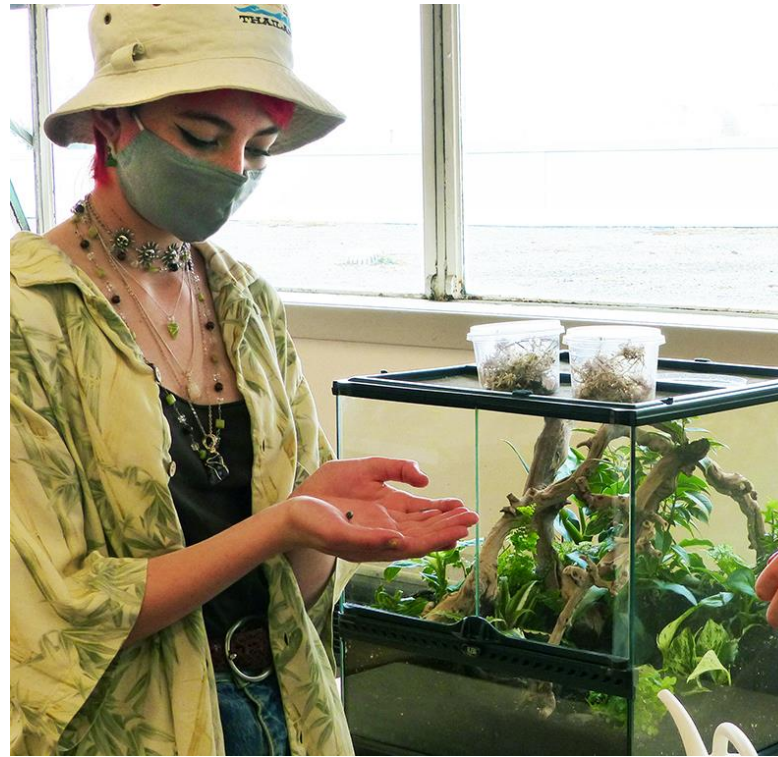

Tropical Plants and Exotic Isopods!

Ayla Leckenby planted a tropical bioactive vivarium this spring as an independent science project. Ayla researched the species of plants and organisms and the vivarium is now home to many springtails (tiny jumping insects), exotic isopods and a Crested Gecko named Ernie (who isn't likely to eat the isopods!).

A few weeks ago researchers from Northwestern University contacted Mr. Young and asked permission to use images and video of the Gumboot Chiton radula for their research paper - Vic High Marine happens to have some of the best video of Gumboot Chiton radula on the internet!

*The researchers decided to try creating a new **3-D printer “ink”** inspired by the chiton tooth. They started with a compound similar to chitin and then added two liquids: one containing iron and one containing phosphate. Mixing the ingredients together yielded a thick paste that was studded with tiny particles of a mineral similar to santabarbarite. “And then it’s ready to be printed — you can just transfer it into your 3-D printer,” Dr. Stegbauer said. 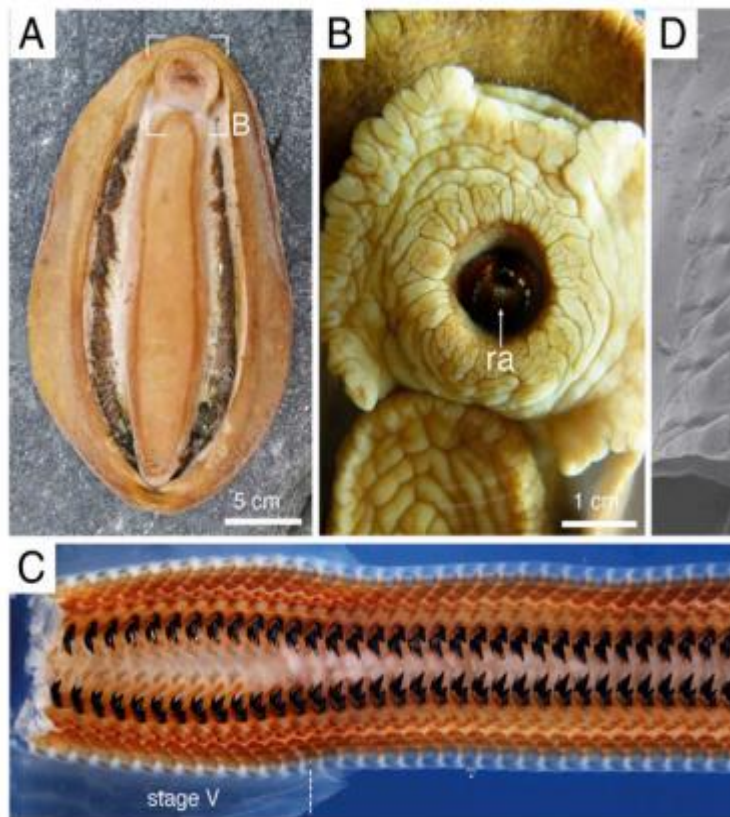


Fig. 1. Radula teeth of *C. stelleri*. (A) Ventral aspect of *C. stelleri* [In radula (ra) (B)]. Image credit: VicHigh Marine/David Young. (C) Mosaic of the organic scaffold (stage I), infiltration of the cusp with ferrihydrite (stage II), and mature teeth (stage V). (D) SEM image of the anterior end of the radula.

The teeth of a chiton are on a ribbon-like structure called a radula.

They are perfect for scraping algae off of rocks all day.
