
Social Justice

Students in Social Justice 12 were invited to listen to a conversation titled Climate Justice, Climate Grief, Climate Action: Intergenerational Dialogue on Climate Change, between long-time activists, scholars, and youth currently working to protect the old growth trees at Fairy Creek, as well as other climate actions. Topics such as intergenerational climate inequity, climate anxiety, and climate action were discussed. Critical questions around protection, incorporating Indigenous ways of knowing, the role of cities planning, and intergenerational inequities were explored. This was a partnership between the City of Victoria and the Canadian Urban Institute, who wanted to know: what do youth think adults should do to support them in their fight for climate justice?

French Immersion

Students in our French Immersion program have been very busy this Fall! We have been happy to welcome so many new faces to our program and to Sandra Justice, who will be teaching Français Langue, Education Physique and Career Life Education in our program until the end of December.

Our grade 9 and 10 students had the amazing opportunity to partake in an outing to Chocolat Favoris, an ice cream shop downtown that originates in Quebec and is a local spot where students can order in French! Before the outing, grade 11 students Danya and Isabella prepared a lesson on the origins of the shop and the importance of finding local places to speak the French language around town. It was incredible to see two more senior students preparing and delivering a lesson in French and I am very proud of the role modeling that they displayed. All of our students enrolled in French Language Arts classes this quarter also had the opportunity to visit La Belle Patate restaurant in Esquimalt. This is a favorite field trip for many students as they love to sample the authentique québecois food and love to get on the bus and adventure through town. This is another great local spot where students can order their food in French! Our senior students had the opportunity to virtually attend a presentation from Simon Fraser's French Cohort program, a program that offers French Immersion programming at the post-secondary level. Many students were excited to hear of the post-secondary options that are offered to them in French and have had many meaningful discussions this term about the benefits of their bilingualism.

As we move towards the second quarter of the year we look forward to welcoming more students into our classes. We will be working in conjunction with our librarian, Wendy Burleson, to host some franco café sessions during FOCU block to allow students to continue developing their language skills when they are not currently enrolled in a French Immersion class and we will be heading over to the Save-On-Foods Memorial Center for a French Immersion skate on December 1st. There is so much more excitement in store for our French Immersion students this year!





Clerical Support (On Call)

Our District is seeking people with an expertise in office administration and who wish to start a career in our schools and District Departments. If you are available Monday-Friday between 8:00am and 3:30pm then this may be the opportunity to make your knowledge and expertise count. On an as-needed basis you may work Monday through Friday for 16 to 35 hours, but not on major holidays, Christmas, Spring Break or during the summer months. It could be a perfect fit for you.

As part of our administrative spare board, you may be called to replace a School Administrative Assistant, Secretarial Clerk or School Assistant. Some of the duties may include greeting parents and students, directing incoming calls, preparing documents, spreadsheets and newsletters, supervising students, and processing monies for projects and expenses for on-going operations. Starting on our spare board will allow you to gain experience in any of our 45 schools and can lead to continuing employment when you are ready.

This position falls within the CUPE Collective Agreement at a pay rate of \$22.14 – \$27.26 per hour plus 11% in lieu of benefits. The hours and location of work will vary with the assignment.

This position requires individuals to have 50+ WPM or data entry equivalency; completion of an office administration certificate and basic bookkeeping skills. Applicants must have sound clerical/office skills, proficiency in Microsoft Office, ability to work independently with minimal supervision, be willing to adapt to a changing work environment and be comfortable with face to face communication with the general public.
