Social Studies 12 Options

- Only 1 Socials 11/12 course is required for graduation
- Many students take 3 or more as academic preparation for Social Sciences/ Humanities/ Arts programs
- Most of the Socials 11/12 courses
 qualify as "academic 12" courses for
 post-secondary programs but do your
 research to be sure!

Social Studies Electives

- Gender & Sexuality 12
- Criminology 12

These are high interest electives.

They don't satisfy the Socials graduation requirement.

They may support your application to a post-secondary social sciences program.

Math 11 Options

- Workplace Math 11 (meets admission requirements for some college programs)
- Foundations of Math 11 (meets admission requirements for many university programs)
- Pre-calculus Math 11 (required for several university programs, such as Commerce, Math, Science, Engineering, Computer Science)



If you passed Workplace Math 10

- Workplace Math 11
- May follow with Foundations of Math 10
- Do WMa11 <u>first</u> to ensure grad
- Check teacher's recommendation

 Consider taking it at Summer School (if available)

AND...


 Select a Math 10 & a Math 11 for next year

Science 11/12 Options

- Chemistry 11 (A or B in Foundations & Pre-cal Math 10 strongly recommended)
- Chemistry 12 (Chem 11 pre-req)
- Physics 11 (strong results in FMP 10 required)
- Physics 12 (Physics 11 pre-req)
- Earth Science 11
- Life Sciences 11
- Anatomy and Physiology 12

These options all satisfy the Science Grad requirement

Science 11/12

- 1 science 11/12 required for graduation
- Many students take 3 or more sciences
- Several post-secondary programs require specific science courses
- Anatomy 12 may be taken without Life Sciences 11 - a grade 11 science is recommended
- Students often take a grade 11 & 12 science in the same year

Science 11/12 Electives

- Astronomy 11
- Marine Biology 12

These are high interest electives
They don't satisfy the Science graduation
requirement

They may support your application to a post-secondary sciences program

CLE: Career Life Education or ECC (French Immersion students)

This important course is required for graduation. A few things you'll learn:

- Employability skills
- ✓ Workplace safety
- ✓ Career-life research
- Financial planning tools
- Labour market trends
- ✓ About opportunities: pre- & post-grad.
- Select #5 CLE unless you will complete it this year – or choose another elective on Line #9

Electives

Select 3 electives (or 4 if CLE completed)

FRIM students - select 2 (or 3)

- Select 2 alternates
- Select 1 or more "Outside-thetimetable" elective(s) – in addition to your 8 courses- if you wish

Choosing Electives

- In general, choose gr. 11 electives unless you've already taken them
- Check <u>prerequisites</u> for gr. 11/12 electives (on VHS website)
- Repeating a course: if you re-take the same course, same grade level, you only earn credits once.

Trades Electives

Please note:

- Trades electives will be <u>PAIRED</u> for 2022/2023
- Students will spend full mornings or full afternoons in one semester at Fairey Tech for trades courses
- See Course Selection Form for specifics

Trades Electives cont'd...

For Grade 11's & 12's only:

- You may apply for a study block in September if you wish to take just ONE trades course
- Please select a PAIR on your form

What is Dual Credit?

A chance to earn <u>BOTH</u> high school and post secondary credits in Grade 12

- You become a Camosun/UVic student
- You take a post-secondary course (tuition is covered) while a high school student
- You do pay for texts and student fees





Dual Credit cont'd.

Some classes happen on-campus at UVic or Camosun

□ Camosun – many offerings *

 UVIC- uSTART- take a univerity level course while in Grade 12

Receive Credit for Law Studies 12 AND



Criminal Justice 154 = 8 credits

* OPEN TO GRADE 12 STUDENTS ONLY

Post-Secondary Options

- Graduation: Complete all required courses & assessments, + earn at least 16/80 credits (Gr. 12/total credits)
- 2. College Career Programs: Wide variety of programs some specific math and/or English requirements –do your research!

Post-Secondary Options (cont'd.)

3. University Transfer Programs (UT):
college courses that may transfer to
universities – English Studies 12 with
minimum C+ (+ Math/ Science courses
for some programs)

Post-Secondary Options (cont'd.)

- 4. University Entrance: English 12 + three to five academic grade 12 courses (confirm with the institution); sometimes a 2nd language to gr. 11
- Note: some universities look for 6 8 Gr. 12 courses in area of intended study
- Do your research!

No reward without effort.
