Principal's Message

We are in that extremely busy time of the year when we are preparing for next year while staying focused on a successful final term. We are anticipating another large incoming class (225 new grade 9s). While we believe we will be able to accommodate our in-catchment students, we will likely have very little availability for the growing number of out of catchment students who have expressed an interest in attending Vic High. The project team is confident we will be able to move back into our newly renovated campus in January. Along with the many new and/or updated amenities the renovated building will allow us to accommodate an additional 200+ students.

The 2023 grad season is well underway, and excitement continues to build, especially as we welcome a full return to an in-person grad ceremony and celebrations. The formal graduation ceremony will take place on June 6th and it will once again be hosted at the University of Victoria. Guest tickets for this

The next in-person grad assembly will be May 11th.

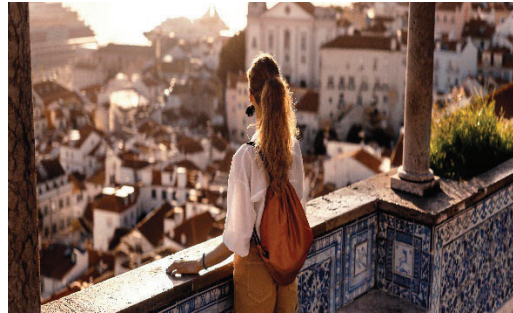

We are also excited to celebrate our largest French Immersion graduating class to date at the recognition ceremony in June! Felicitations!!!!

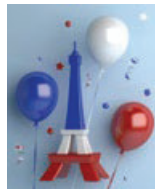

Friday: On Friday we concluded our French Week! We had so much [#FrancoFun!](#) Thank you to Nyla for leading this student led initiative.



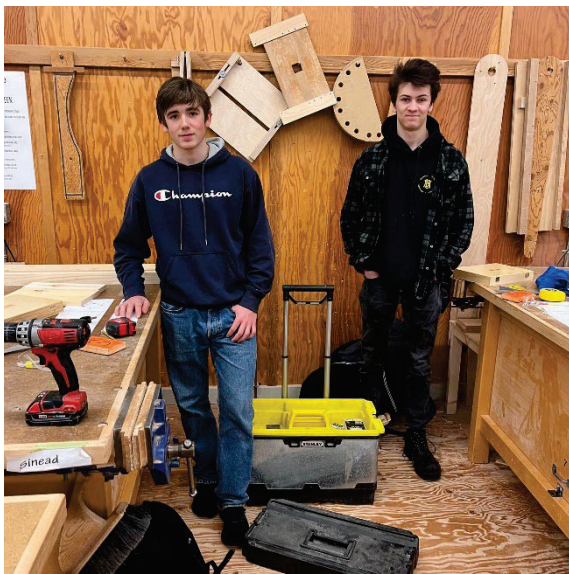


Skills Canada!

Phyllis Webster recently visited the Social Justice class at Victoria High School after a hiatus of several years. The first discussion, which was around the value of education, elicited many interesting ideas. One of these ideas was that an education helps people become more conscious of their responsibilities to their family, their society, and their world and helps them to make ethical choices. After reading the Readers' Theatre, *Climbing the Ladder to Success: Barriers to Education for Girls in sub-Saharan Africa*, the students were particularly concerned about Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) and early marriage for girls.

Their remarkable teacher, Ms. Hope, delivers a very rich program about social justice to her students, many of whom are international students. It is always a privilege and an honour to visit with her students. The bananas were part of a scavenger hunt for a fundraiser.
