## GRADUATION REOUIREMENTS

$\checkmark$ Required courses in Grades 10, 11 and 12
$\checkmark$ Credits: Minimum 80 (20 courses) to graduate. Sixteen credits must be at a Grade 12 level (4 courses).
$\checkmark$ Assessments (Num 10, Lit 10, Lit 12, Evaluation de litteratie 12)

Repeating a course: if you re-take the same course, same grade level, you only earn credits once
