

- Required courses in Grades 10, 11 and 12
- Credits: Minimum 80 (20 courses) to graduate. Sixteen credits must be at a Grade 12 level (4 courses).
- ✓ Assessments (Num 10, Lit 10, Lit 12, Evaluation de litteratie 12)

- Check teacher's recommendation

Choosing Electives cont'd....


- Check course <u>prerequisites</u> (on VHS website)
