

# Review of BC's Graduation Requirements (Gr. 10-12)



## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Required courses in Grades 10, 11 and 12
- Credits minimum 80 credits to graduate (20 courses)
  - 16 credits (four courses) must be at a Grade 12 level
- ✓ Assessments (Num 10, Lit 10, Lit 12, Evaluation de litteratie 12)

# GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

## Other requirements:

- One Grade 10-12 ADST or AE course (e.g., Art, Computers, Trades, Cooking...etc.)
- One Indigenous focused course

## More Key Points

If you don't complete a Grade 10 course required for graduation, it will not go away...

- Select the required course as one of your electives (e.g. English 10)
- You may also take the Grade 11
   corresponding course in the same year
   (e.g. Composition 11)

## Language Arts 11 Options

One of the following is required to grad:

- Composition 11
- Literary Studies 11
- English First Peoples 11 (meets Indigenous focused course requirement)
- French Immersion students <u>also</u> take Français Langue 11

## **ELL Students**

If English is NOT your first language, there may be language support classes that can be added to your schedule.

See your ELL support teacher (Ms. McTavish)

If you know you'd like an ELL support block, simply request "ELL Class" as an Elective choice

## Social Studies 12 Options

At least one of the following is <u>required</u> to grad:

- Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12 (meets Indigenous focused course requirement, new course)
- Comparative Cultures 12
- Law Studies 12
- Asian Studies 12 (new course)
- Political Studies 12
- Human Geography 12
- 20<sup>th</sup> Century World History 12

## Other Social Studies Courses:

These options don't satisfy the Socials graduation requirement but are great high interest electives:

- Criminology 12
- Psychology 11

## Math 11 Options

#### One of the following is required to graduate:

- Workplace Math 11: meets admission requirements for general college admission
- Foundations of Math 11: meets admission requirements for many university programs at most, but not all, universities
- Pre-calculus Math 11: necessary for several programs (at university or college), such as Business, Math, Science, Engineering, Computer Science, some Medical Programs etc.

## Choosing your Math 11

If you passed Foundations of Math & Pre-calculus 10

- a. Pre-calculus 11 (A or B in FMP 10 recommended)
- b. Foundations of Math 11
- c. Workplace Math 11
- Check your teacher's recommendation AND post-secondary program requirements

## Choosing your Math 11

If you passed Workplace Math 10

- Select Workplace Math 11
- May follow later with Foundations of Math and Precalculus 10
- Do WMa11 first to ensure grad

Check teacher's recommendation AND post-secondary program requirements

## Math 12

- Math 12 NOT required for graduation
- Pre-cal. 12 is required for some post-secondary programs (e.g., Sciences, Maths, Health Sciences, Engineering, Business etc.)
- Calculus 12 most university programs don't require it, but, do your postsecondary research carefully!

## Thinking about your Math...

- What course did I take this year?
   MATH
   What was my grade? How hard was it?
- What do I need going forward?
   Graduation? After high school? Post-secondary pre-requisites?
- How hard am I willing to work?
- Check with you math teacher for recommendations

## Science 11/12 Options

## One of the following required to grad:

- Chemistry 11 (Foundations of Math and Pre-cal. required)
- Physics 11 (strong results in FMP 10 required)
- Life Sciences 11
- Environmental Sciences 11
- Anatomy & Physiology 12
- These all satisfy the Science Grad requirement.



## Other Science 11/12 Courses

These options don't satisfy the Science graduation requirement, but are great high interest electives:

- Astronomy 11
- Marine Biology 12

## Career Education

• In Grade 11 students take Career Life Education 10

Or

• Education au Choix de Carriere..10 (FRIM students)

## **Choosing Electives**

#### What Are electives?

 Electives are any courses not required for graduation (academic or non-academic)



# Choosing Electives cont'd....

 In general, choose Gr. 11 electives unless you've already taken them

## **BUT**

- Check the Course Pre-requisites (Vic High website)
- Write the name of the course <u>and</u>
   the course number on your course
   selection sheet

## Information ONLY Dual- Credit Post-Secondary Opportunities:

What are they?

- chance to earn <u>BOTH</u> high school and post secondary credits in Grade 12
- You become a Camosun/UVic student
- You take a post-secondary course or program (tuition is covered) while a high school student
- You do pay for texts and student fees





## **Dual Credit Post-Secondary**

Most classes happen on-campus at UVic or Camosun

- Camosun Programs many offerings (e.g. Foods Program, Electrical Program)
- UVIC- uSTART- take a university level course while in Grade 12





# Dual Credit <u>Law 12/Crim 154</u> at Vic High

- In timetable at Vic High in semester 2 of Grade 12 year
- Students receive Credit for

  Law Studies 12 AND

  Criminal Justice 154 (Camosun) = 8 credits

#### OPEN TO GRADE 12 STUDENTS ONLY

 Co-taught by Mr. Wallace & a Camosun Criminal Justice Instructor
