

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Required courses in Grades 10, 11 and 12
- Credits minimum 80 credits to graduate (20 courses)
 - 16 credits (four courses) must be at a Grade 12 level
- ✓ Assessments (Num 10, Lit 10, Lit 12, Evaluation de litteratie 12)

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Other requirements:

- One Grade 10-12 ADST or AE course (e.g., Art, Computers, Trades, Cooking...etc.)
- One Indigenous focused course

More Key Points

If you don't complete a course required for graduation, it will not go away...

- Select the required course as one of your electives (e.g. an English 11)
- You may also take the Grade 12
 corresponding course in the same year
 (e.g. an English 12)


Post-Secondary Considerations

- Required Grade 12 courses vary widely between programs and between post-secondaries
- Universities (competitive entry): Generally require an English 12 plus 3-5 <u>Approved Grade 12 Academic Courses</u>; programs may have specific course requirements (e.g., Nursing, Engineering, Business, Science etc.)
- Camosun College: requires English 12 C+ and then program specific courses. Some programs have competitive entry (e.g., Registered Nursing)
- Camosun also offers upgrading and university transfer courses
- · Some programs require supplemental applications and/or portfolios

DO YOUR POST-SEC. RESEARCH CAREFULLY!

How do I research post-secondary requirements?

Start by going to the institution's home page and clicking on admissions, and then undergraduate studies

If English is NOT your first language, there may be language support classes that can be added to your schedule.

If you know you'd like an ELL support block, simply request "ELL Class" as an Elective choice

Social Studies 11/12 Options

One of the following is required to grad:

- Asian studies (new course)
- BC First Peoples 12 (meets Indigenous focused course requirement). Not offered in 2024-2025
- Comparative Cultures 12
- Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12 (meets Indigenous focused course requirement; new course)
- Human Geography 12

Cont'd Social Studies 11/12 Options

- Law 12
- Political Studies 12
- 20th Century World History 12
- Social Justice 12 (not offered in 2024-2025)

These options all satisfy the Socials Grad requirement

Other Social Studies Courses:

These options don't satisfy the Socials graduation requirement but are great high interest electives:

- Criminology 12
- Psychology 11

Math 11 Options

One of the following is required to graduate:

- Workplace Math 11: meets general college admission requirements
- Foundations of Math 11: meets admission requirements for many university programs at many, but not all, universities
- Pre-calculus Math 11: necessary for several programs (at university or college), such as Business, Math, Science, Engineering, Computer Science, some Medical Programs etc.
- Do your post-secondary research!

Choosing Math 12

- Math 12 NOT required for graduation
- Precal. 11 is a prerequisite for Precal. 12
- Pre-cal. 12 is required for some postsecondary programs (e.g., Sciences, Maths, Health Sciences, Engineering, Business etc.)
- Calculus 12 most university programs don't require it, but, do our post-secondary research carefully!

Choosing Electives

- An elective is any course not required for graduation (academic and nonacademic)
- Many Grade 12 classes have prerequisites. Check course pre-requisites (on VHS website) carefully

Dual Credit Post-Secondary Opportunities:

A chance to earn <u>BOTH</u> high school and post secondary credits in Grade 12

- You become a Camosun/UVic student
- You take a post-secondary course or program (tuition is covered) while a high school student
- You do pay for texts and student fees





Dual Credit Post-Secondary

Most classes happen on-campus at UVic or Camosun

- Camosun many offerings
- UVIC has uSTART- take a university level course while in Grade 12

Dual Credit at UVIC (U-start)

- U-START is an opportunity for <u>highly</u> academic students to take a university course at UVIC, while in Grade 12
- Application required
- Applications due by March 6th
- If interested, must attend the information session Monday February 26th at lunch in the Career Centre.

Dual Credit Law 12/Crim 154 at Vic High (Grade 12 students only)

- In timetable at Vic High in semester 2
- Students receive Credit for
 - Law Studies 12 AND
 - Criminal Justice 154 (Camosun) = 8 credits
- Already taken Law 12?
 - You can still earn 8 credits for the Law/Crim 154 course

Co-taught by Mr. Wallace & a Camosun Criminal Justice Instructor

Dual Credit Law 12/Crim. 154 at Vic High (cont'd...)

- Application is required
- Information Session with Mr. Wallace at lunch Tuesday February 27th in Room 120
- Admission requires a C+ in English 12 or English First Peoples 12 by the end of Semester 1 of 2024/2025
