Review of BC's Graduation Requirements



<u>GRADUATION</u> <u>REQUIREMENTS</u>

- Required courses in Grades 10, 11 and 12
- Credits minimum 80 credits to graduate (20 courses)
 - 16 credits (four courses) must be at a Grade 12 level
- Assessments (Num 10, Lit 10, Lit 12, Evaluation de litteratie 12)

More Key Points

If you don't complete a course required for graduation, it will not go away...


- Select the required course as one of your electives (e.g. an English 11)
- You may also take the Grade 12 corresponding course in the same year (e.g. an English 12)

Post-Secondary Considerations

- Required Grade 12 courses vary widely between programs and between post-secondaries
- Universities (competitive entry): Generally, require an English 12 plus 3-5 <u>Approved Grade 12 Academic Courses</u>; programs may have specific course requirements (e.g., Nursing, Engineering, Business, Science etc.)
- Camosun College: requires English 12 C+ and then program specific courses. Some programs have competitive entry (e.g., Registered Nursing)
- Camosun also offers upgrading and university transfer courses
- Some programs require supplemental applications and/or portfolios

DO YOUR POST-SEC. RESEARCH CAREFULLY!

ELL Students

If English is NOT your first language, there may be language support classes that can be added to your schedule.

See your ELL support teacher (Ms. McTavish)

If you know you'd like an ELL support block, simply request "ELL Class" as an Elective choice

Social Studies 11/12 Options

One of the following is <u>required</u> to grad:

- Asian Studies
- Comparative World Religions 12
- Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12 (meets Indigenous focused course requirement)
- Human Geography 12
- Political Studies 12
- Law 12
- 20th Century History

Other Social Studies Courses:

These options don't satisfy the Socials graduation requirement but are great high interest electives:

- Criminology 12
- Psychology 11

Math 11 Options

One of the following is <u>required</u> to graduate:

- Workplace Math 11: meets general college
 admission requirements
- Foundations of Math 11: meets admission requirements for many university programs at many, but not all, universities
- Pre-calculus Math 11: necessary for several programs (at university or college), such as Business, Math, Science, Engineering, Computer Science, some Medical Programs etc.
- Do your post-secondary research!


Choosing Math 12

- Math 12 NOT required for graduation
- Precal. 11 is a prerequisite for Precal. 12
 - Pre-cal. 12 is required for some postsecondary programs (e.g., Sciences, Maths, Health Sciences, Engineering, Business etc.)
 Calculus 12 – most university programs don't require it, but, do our post-secondary research carefully!

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Science 11/12 Options

One of the following <u>required</u> to grad:

- Chemistry 11 (Foundations of Math and Pre-cal. required)
- Physics 11 (strong results in FMP 10 required)
- Life Sciences 11
- Environmental Sciences 11
- Science for Citizens 11



• Anatomy & Physiology 12

These all satisfy the Science Grad requirement.

Science 11/12 Options

- Chemistry 12 (Chem. 11 required)
- Physics 12 (Physics 11 required)
- Anatomy & Physiology 12
- These all satisfy the Science Grad requirement.



Other Science 11/12 Courses

These options don't satisfy the Science graduation requirement, but are great high interest electives:

- Astronomy 11
- Marine Biology 12

Career Education

Two required courses:

- In Grade 11 students take Career Life Education 10 or *Education au Choix de Carriere..(FRIM)*
- In Grade 12 students take Career Life Connections or *Liens avec la vie...(FRIM)* Out of timetable course
 - > Next Steps (planning for your future)
 - > Mentor Interview
 - Capstone Project
 - > 30 hours Experiential Learning

Choosing Electives

- An elective is any course not required for graduation (academic and nonacademic)
- Many Grade 12 classes have prerequisites. Check course pre-requisites (on VHS website) carefully
- Write the name of the course and the course number




In Timetable Electives:

District Career Programs

- What are District Career programs?
- A collection of courses taken in one career area
- ✓ Usually, these courses are taken at one of the high schools in Victoria for an entire semester
- Some courses may be held during the summer months
- ✓ All require applications
- See Sam Spetter in the Career Centre

Some Examples of District Career Programs:

- **TASK:** Trades Exploration Gr.11 or 12 Sem.2 at Lambrick
- Hair Styling Program: Gr.11&12 at Vic High
- Auto Tech: Gr.11 or 12 Sem. 2 at Esquimalt
- <u>Graphic Design</u>: Summer Program (before Gr. 11 or Gr. 12)
- <u>Tourism & Leadership</u>: Summer Program (before Gr. 11 or 12)
- & more...

Dual Credit Post-Secondary Opportunities:

- A chance to earn <u>BOTH</u> high school and post secondary credits in Grade 12
- You become a Camosun/UVic student
- You take a post-secondary course or program (tuition is covered) while a high school student

You do pay for texts and student fees





Dual Credit Post-Secondary

Most classes happen on-campus at UVic or Camosun

- Camosun many offerings
- UVIC has uSTART- take a university level course while in Grade 12

Dual Credit at UVIC (U-start)

- U-START is an opportunity for <u>highly</u> academic students to take a university course at UVIC, while in Grade 12
- Application required
- See Ms. Spetter for more information



Dual Credit <u>Criminology 12 & Crim 166</u> (Camosun) at Vic High

- In timetable at Vic High in semester 2 of your Grade 12 year
 Students receive Credit for Criminology 12 AND Criminology 166 (Camosun) = 8 credits
 OPEN TO GRADE 12 STUDENTS ONLY
- Co-taught by Mr. Wallace & a Camosun Criminology Instructor

Dual Credit Criminology 12 & Criminology 166 at Vic High

- Application is required
- Information Session with Mr. Wallace/Mr. Bradley – at lunch Wed Feb. 19 and Thurs. Feb 20 in Room 308
- Admission requires a C+ in English 12 or English First Peoples 12 by the end of Semester 1 of 2025/2026

Dual Credit <u>Political Studies 12 & Political</u> <u>Science 105 (</u>Camosun) at Vic High

- In timetable at Vic High in semester 2 of your Grade 12 year
- Students receive Credit for Political Studies 12 AND Poltical Science 105 (Camosun) = 8 credits
 OPEN TO GRADE 12 STUDENTS ONLY
- Co-taught by Mr. Bradley & a Camosun Political Science Instructor

Dual Credit <u>Political Studies 12 & Political</u> <u>Science 105 (Camosun) at Vic High</u>

- Application is required
- Information Session with Mr. Wallace/ Mr. Bradley – at lunch Wed Feb. 19 and Thurs. Feb. 20 in Room 308
- Admission requires a C+ in English 12 or English First Peoples 12 by the end of Semester 1 of 2024/2025
